Did You Get A New Pet For Christmas ?



Now that you have a new friend, it's best to be prepared to prevent confusion and stress for both you and your pet.



Establish the rules. Decide who's responsible for what: grooming, feeding, exercising, cleaning, and play-time. Also establish all areas that are "off-limits" for your new pet. For example, you may not want your pet to sleep on the bed.



Have all the necessary supplies ready. Examples are food, bowls, leash or harness, collar, brush, and so on.



Safety. Make sure everyone knows how to safely handle your pet.



Pet-proof your home. Lock away household chemicals, such as cleansers, insecticide, antifreeze, and others. Be sure to clean up spills immediately. Many houseplants are poisonous, so keep them out of reach.



Tie electrical cords out of the way, if you can. Dogs and cats can chew on electrical cords - or even catch them while walking (or running!), causing lamps, TVs, & radios to fall.



Keep doors closed - this includes the doors to your washer and dryer, your closets, the cupboards ... inquisitive little animals can sneak in just about anywhere!

Share dried apple rings with the pet rabbit as a tasty toy.

Thread bailing twine through the open center of a few dried apple slices. Tie the slices from the roof of the rabbit cage with enough twine to let them dangle down for the rabbit to chew on.
