May 2 to 8, 2010

Join the event that's been celebrated every year since 1915, Be Kind to Animals Week. In this annual tradition, we commemorate the role animals' play in our lives, promote ways to treat them humanely, and encourage others, especially children, to do the same. And while Be Kind to Animals Week is celebrated only once a year, there are ways people can be kind to animals every day.



Speak out for animals: Learn about policies that can impact the animals in your community and throughout the country.



Report animal abuse: If you see something that looks suspicious don't wait. Let someone know. If you see outright abuse, don't confront the owner. This is for your safety. Call your local humane officer or police department.



Appreciate wildlife: All animals deserve to be treated humanely -- family pets and animals in the wild. Create an inviting space in your yard and garden for butterflies, hummingbirds and other creatures.



Adopt a pet from a shelter or rescue: Help animals find a second chance at happiness by adopting your next pet from your local shelter or rescue group.

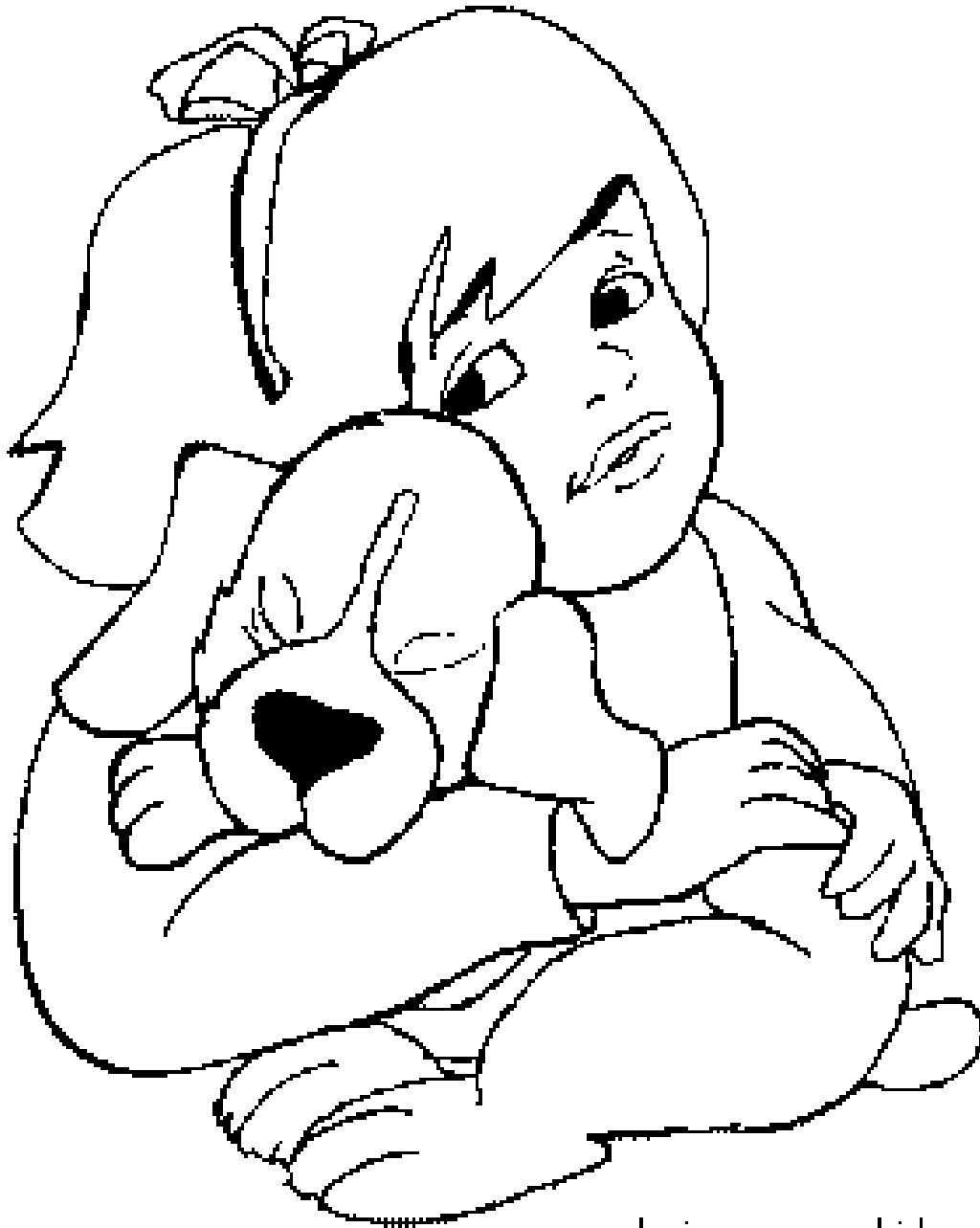


Take care of your pet: Pets are like children who never grow up. They need you to help keep them healthy and safe throughout their lives.
