



Check out these ideas... .





WALK YOUR DOG MONTH!

Did you know?

There are many benefits to walking your dog...

- Great Exercise
- Weight Control
- Helps Joints
- Helps With Digestion
- Bonding Time
- Keeps Them Busy
- Fresh Air

Most dogs need to be walked at least once each day, though active dogs may need more.



Supplies Needed

- Good-fitting collar
- ID Tag (on collar)
- Updated microchip (if applicable)
- Sturdy leash
- Poop bags
- Treats
- Toys
- Water (as needed)
- Weather Gear (as needed)

Reminders

- Respect the space of other people and animals
- Ask BEFORE approaching with your pup.



COLD WEATHER PET SAFETY TIPS

Just like people, pets' cold tolerance can vary from pet to pet based on their coat, body fat stores, activity level, and health. Be aware of your pet's tolerance for cold weather, and adjust accordingly. You will probably need to shorten your dog's walks in very cold weather to protect you both from weather-associated health risks.

Keep your pet indoors and warm.

Like people, cats and dogs are susceptible to frostbite and hypothermia, and generally should be kept inside.



Play Dress-up.

Consider a jacket or sweater when walking your pet outside. Some pet owners also use booties to protect their dog's feet.

Wipe down.

During walks, your dog's feet, legs, and belly may pick up de-icing products, antifreeze, or other chemicals that could be toxic. When you get back inside, wipe down (or wash) your pet's feet, legs and belly to remove these chemicals.

Avoid ice.

When walking your dog, stay away from frozen ponds, lakes and other water. You don't know if the ice will support your dog's weight, and if your dog breaks through the ice it could be deadly.

Collar and chip.

Many pets become lost in winter because snow and ice can hide recognizable scents that might normally help your pet find his/her way back home. Make sure your pet has a well-fitting collar and/or microchip with up-to-date identification and contact information.




